Set date for admission & procedure



Receive admission information & financial discussion



Return home

# INPATIENT JOURNEY

## On Admission Day



Register at admission counter



Sign authorisation form for admission



Admission process: Documents verification



Ward allocation subject to bed availability



Ward

- Admission to allocated bed
- Height, weight & vital signs are taken
- Ward orientation provided to patient and caregiver
- Sign procedure consent
- Medical examination:
  - Blood test
  - ECHO
  - CXR
  - Lung function test
  - ECG



Patient preparation

- Intravenous insertion
- Skin preparation: Iodine & plaster test
- Fast 4-6 hours before procedure
- Take pre-medication if required



Post procedure

- Vital signs and puncture site (groin / femoral) are monitored closely
  - Tight plaster is applied to prevent bleeding
  - Rest in bed for 6 hours (if groin approach)
  - Patient is allowed to eat once he/she returns to the ward
- Undergo ECG if required
- Doctor inspects puncture site and dressing is changed to small plaster
